Bomu Hospital is a not for profit registered and recognized non-governmental healthcare organization. It is a project of Mkomani Clinic Society (MCS), an entity that came into existence in the late 70's when a group of citizens who were conscious of the dire lack of accessible, affordable health care services for the poor and destitute, got together and established a small outpatient facility in the Mkomani area of Mombasa Kenya. In the last 40years, the Society has grown, and so has its activities. Today, MCS operates the Bomu Hospital, its flagship institution that is located in Changamwe, close to the Moi International Airport. The facility has several health care programs that cater to the health care needs of the poor, malnourished and the HIV affected and afflicted.

Bomu Hospital supports six orphanages with food ration on a weekly basis. Through donors, we were able to donate scholastic material to the below orphanage.





Dr. Kaliti, a fistula surgeon, conducted a training session with health care workers from Kilifi, Kwale and Mombasa Counties on how to screen for fistula. The free screening and treatment week took place from 21st to 26th January 2019 at the main hospital.







A Peer Educators training was organized at Bomu Hospital. The training took place over three days of which the last day involved outdoor activities at an external venue.

On 17th February 2019, we partnered with Lions Club of Mombasa Pwani to conduct a free eye medical camp that took place at the main hospital in Changamwe. Over 400 patients were screened and several of them got prescriptions glasses at a subsidized rate.

DREAMS is a new program targeting adolescents and young girls who are HIV negative. The program aims to equip them with skills and knowledge to maintain an HIV free lifestyle.

Bomu Hospital partners with the Sunni Muslim Association to provide free circumcision services at a medical camp organized in Shimoni.

The camp took place over three days. 300 children were attended to and 68 boys were circumcised.











Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) targets HIV negative individuals who are exposed to high risk activities. The activities of this program are monitored by the sub-county.


